
## Facts about Poultry



- 1. The color of an egg is determined by the color of the hen's ears! (Yes, chickens have ears!)
- 2. Hens are female chickens. Roosters are male chickens. Pullets are females that are less than one year old.
- Hens are female turkeys. Toms are male turkeys.
- 4. Chickens can have three different kinds of combs. (Pea, rose, and single)
- A healthy chicken lays about 265 eggs each year.
- An average chicken has 8,325 feathers.
- You do not need to have a rooster with a hen to get the hens to lay eggs. You only need a rooster if you want to hatch baby chicks.
- It takes a hen 24-26 hours to lay an egg.
- The closest living relative of a T-Rex dinosaur is a chicken.
- It takes 4 pounds of feed to make 1 dozen eggs.
- Some chickens lay eggs and some chickens are used for meat.
- Iowa produces the most eggs in the United States. Indiana comes in second, then Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, California, Michigan, Minnesota, Georgia, and finally Nebraska.
- Minnesota is the top producing turkey state in America. Next is North Carolina, then Arkansas, Indiana, Missouri, and Virginia.
- 14. **Indiana** produces the most chicken meat in the United States. Next is Pennsylvania, then Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, Arkansas, Michigan, and finally California.
- Poultry stomachs are called, "gizzards".
- The average chicken weighs 6 pounds.
- The average turkey weighs 15 pounds.
